

EXAMS

Residents have the responsibility for completing several various examinations during their residency program. With the exception of two examinations, all others are the responsibility of the resident to follow through to ensure that they are registered and that they have prepared appropriately for specified examinations.

During residency training, there will be OSCEs held on an annual basis that all residents (PGY1 to PGY5) will be required to attend and participate in. All residents (PGY1 to PGY5) will also be required to write the AUA In-Training examination in November. Residents will be enrolled to participate in this examination by the residency office.

Optional:

Residents have the option of applying to write the United States Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE) starting in their first year. This examination is not a mandatory requirement for the program.

PGY1

During the first year of training residents are required to register to write the POS during their second year of training. This requires a preliminary assessment of training to be submitted to the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC) in the fall of the first year of training.

PGY2

During the fall of a resident's second year, they are required to complete the MCCQE Part II (having successfully completed the MCCQE Part I prior to being matched to the program). Successful completion of MCCQE part I & II will entitle the resident to be recognized as a Licentiate of the Medical Council of Canada (LMCC).

During the spring of a resident's second year, they are required to complete the POS, which they registered for during their first year of training.

PGY4

During the fourth year of training residents are required to update your file with the RCPSC to write the Fellowship Exam in the spring of your fifth year. This can be done through an e-mail request to the Office of Education - Credentials (credentials@rcpsc.edu), stating your full name and specialty.

PGY5

During the early summer of a resident's fifth year, on approval of the Program Director and successful completion of the FITER, residents will their Fellowship Exam.
