


T-RES PROGRAM

T-Res is a Palm and Web-enabled Application that allows medical residents and staff physicians to quickly and easily document their activities in order to enhance the effectiveness of medical education. The application configuration varies by discipline, so that data entry is intuitive, easy, and quick. T-Res runs on PDA (handheld) computers so residents and physicians can enter activities immediately after completion. Data is transferred periodically to a secure central server, via a desktop computer and the Web. Residents, Program Directors and national coordinators use the Web to access different views of the information to meet their individual needs. Confidentiality is provided through the software design and the system structure. Residents (and staff physicians) see only their own information, while Program Directors see only their program's information. Each program "owns" the data generated by its residents and staff physicians. Programs from different universities, but in the same discipline, may choose to use a common "template" so that their data will be comparable. Program directors who choose to participate can then access this shared pool of data, to enhance educational and administrative decision-making.

For all new residents log-on identification and a password will be provided to you on entering into the program. The first time that you access the system, you will be asked to change you password to something that you will remember. All new residents, who do not have a PDA, should contact the Residency Training Office.
