


## WEB ONE45

The Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry has signed a software license agreement with One45 for their WebEval Software for a five-year term. This agreement incorporates all undergraduate medical students and postgraduate residents. This software will allow us to move away from paper based evaluation forms and transcription of written comments, to that of an electronic web based system with a central database. Access to this system is over a secure link to the Internet with user name and password protection. For all new residents to the program, the Urology Residency Office will send an e-mail to you that allows you to log-on to the system and access your information. Once you are logged-on to the system you can access your rotation schedule, send evaluations to preceptors, respond to evaluations of rotation/preceptors and track activities that you have completed.
